ABOUT US

The Catholic University of Malawi is an accredited institution of higher learning established by the Episcopal Conference of Malawi on October 16, 2004. The University started admitting students in 2006 and was officially opened on October 28, 2006 by the late President Bingu wa Mutharika.

It has seven faculties, namely Commerce, Education, Law, Nursing and Midwifery, Science, Social Sciences and Theology. Since its establishment, the University has grown its student body from 129 in 2006 to 5000-plus in 2021.

The Catholic University has held eighteen congregations, with 3173 graduates joining the industry in Malawi and beyond. The University has an affiliation agreement with the Inter-Congregational Institute (Balaka), St. Anthony Major Seminary (Kachebere-Mchinji), and St Peter's Major Seminary (Zomba).



ADMISSION POLICY

The Catholic University of Malawi is open to students of all faiths and respects freedom of thought and expression within the Catholic ethos.


ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must have MSCE or its equivalent, plus credit in six subjects including English and an aggregate score of not more than thirty (30) points and obtained in not more than two sittings in the recent past three years.

The University also considers those with other Advanced/higher certificates and diplomas from approved and accredited institutions in relevant areas of study.

NB: Faculties vet each candidate on case-by-case.

Those who were withdrawn from the Catholic University of Malawi or any other institution of higher learning on academic grounds are NOT eligible for admission.



ENTRY ROUTES & REQUIREMENTS

The University has three entry routes for its undergradute programmes. Requirements of each entry route are as follows:

ROUTE 1: ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

A. Malawi School Certificate of Education/Equivalent

Those with MSCE or its equivalent, plus credit in six subjects including English and an aggregate score of not more than thirty (30) points and obtained in more than two sittings in the recent past three years. For Bachelor of Laws (Hons), applicants must have an aggregate score of not more than twenty (20) points.

IGSCE and O-Levels with the following interpretation: IGSCE on an 8-point scale of grade (A*=1; A=2; B=3; C=5; D=7; E=8; F & G=9). O-Level on a 5 point scale of grades as follows: A=1; B=3; C=5; D=7; E=8.

B. "A" Level Qualification

Candidates with A-Level qualification must have a minimum of three principle passes with an aggregate of at least 9 points. Interpretation is as follows: A= 5; B= 4; C=3.

ROUTE 2: BRIDGING

The Bridging Programme is aimed at providing academic study opportunity to those who do not meet the prescribed University normal entry requirements. Those with MSCE or equivalent plus credits in four subjects including English and aggregate of not more than thirty-four (34) points.

The Bridging Programme is also open to those with credits in six subjects including English and an aggregate of

not more than 30 points and qualify to write University Entrance Examinations but choose to gain pre-university experience before admission.

In either of the two scenarios above, applicants must have MSCE or its equivalent obtained in more than two sittings in the recent past two years.

ROUTE 3: ADMISSION THROUGH CONSIDERATION OF PAPERS & CERTIFICATES

The University also considers those with other Advanced/higher certificates and diploma from approved and accredited institutions in relevant areas of study. Faculties vet each candidate on case-by case basis. Such candidates are not required to write University Entrance Exami

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMMES REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be holders of Bachelor's degree in a relevant discipline with at least credit from the Catholic University of Malawi or its equivalent from any recognized institution of higher learning.

In exceptional cases, consideration may be given to those holding a Bachelor's degree in a relevant field with pass, provided that there is evidence of proven research ability.

Applicants must also furnish a letter of financial assurance from their parent(s), guardians, employers or sponsoring agents.

Applicants must pass the Catholic University of Malawi oral interviews.

Applicants are expected to present transcripts of academic records and at least two traceable academic referees.

APPLICATION FORMS

The window for submitting applications is from September to the first week of December each year. Application forms are available at the University's Main Campus (Nguludi, Chiradzulu), the Catholic Secretariat (Area 11, Lilongwe), and all Diocesan Education Offices (Blantyre, Chikwawa, Dedza, Karonga, Lilongwe, Mangochi, Mzuzu and Zomba). The Catholic University of Malawi has one Satellite Centre in Malawi's capital city Lilongwe, at St John's Secondary School. The Centre offers two degree programmes under the faculty commerce, two degree programmes and two diploma programmes under the faculty of social sciences and one degree under the faculty programme education. All lessons for the programmes are offered during weekends and public holidays.

ST. ANTHONY MAJOR SEMINARY, KACHEBERE

This inter-diocesan major seminary sits at the foot of Kalulu Mountain in Mchinji District. It is owned by the Episcopal Conference of Malawi and offers a Bachelor's degree in Philosophy.



ST. PETER'S MAJOR SEMINARY

Located in the university town of Zomba, St Peter's Major Seminary is an inter-diocesan seminary that offers Bachelor's degree in Theology.



INTER-CONGREGATIONAL INSTITUTE (ICI)

Located at Sosola Village, T/A. Nsamala, Balaka District, the consortium of various religious congregations offers Bachelor's degree in Philosophy.



DIRECTORATES, CENTRES AND FACILITIES

CENTRES

The Catholic University established two centres and two directorates as instruments for strenthening organizational learning and fostering meaningful contribution to society. The following are the centres and directorates currently in operation:

Centre for Socio-Theological Studies

The Centre, established in May, 2009, is designed to offer high quality short courses on socio-theological issues of national importance in order to foster the ongoing formation for pastors/priests, religious, laity and implementers of faith based socio-economic programmes. The following are the specific objectives of the Centre:

A.To provide ongoing formation for priests/pastors and religious on socio-theological issues with a view to empowering them with requisite knowledge and skills for addressing 21st-century challenges.

B.To offer formation in Christian faith to lay people and other Church collaborators engaged in the implementation of health, education, social justice and development programmes.

C.To provide thought leadership on matters relating to the interaction between the timeless Word of God and the dynamic human condition.

Centre for Environmental Affairs

The Centre seeks to respond to the cry of the earth by promoting intellectual and cultural habits consistent with the ethics of integral ecology. It takes Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si' (2015) as its Magna Carta.



The Centre's operations are also guided by the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) enunciated in 2015, especially SDG 6 (clean water), SDG 7 (clean energy), SDG 12 (responsible consumption), SDG 13 (climate action), SDG 14 (life under water), and SDG 15 (life on land). Malawi's grand strategy, dubbed Malawi 2063 – inspired by the African Union's Agenda 2063 – also identifies environmental sustainability as one of the enablers for Malawi's vision of attaining an inclusively wealthy and self-reliant nation by 2063.

Among the specific objectives of the Centre for Environmental Affairs are the following: A.To spearhead reflection on the interplay between the nation's development agenda and environmental sustainability.

B.To conduct and publish research on issues relating to the environment.


C.To lobby, through various fora, for legislation that fosters the ethics of integral ecology.

D.To engage the business community in charting a path toward sustainable business practices.

E.Act as an Information Service Centre and in-house resource centre for use by interested parties in all areas of environmental studies and natural resource management.

Directorate of Research and Publication

One of the principal mandates of institutions of higher learning is research and the dissemination of knowledge through publication. The Directorate of Research and Publication is thus tasked with the responsibility of promoting, facilitating and coordinating research initiatives both within the institution and in collaboration with other stakeholders. One of the outlets for research work is the Journal of Catholic University of Malawi (JOCUNIMA), an inter-disciplinary publication. Further, a publications and innovation gallery has been created as a privileged space for exhibiting works published by the University's staff.



Library

To maintain its stand as centre of excellence in providing quality education, the University has 30921 up-to-date books in its magnificent library. The University has also subscription to MALICO, West Law JSTOR, and many other reputable journals.

Facilities

The university has twenty-six classrooms, three Lecture Theatres, one Assembly Hall, three ICT Laboratories, one Physics and Pedology Laboratory, one Biology and Chemistry Laboratory, one Geography Information System (GIS) Laboratory, one Nursing and Midwifery Skills Laboratory.

Clinic

The clinic, certified by Medical Council of Malawi, has four beds. Any serious illness is referred to the nearest hospital, namely St Joseph Hospital (Nguludi).

Sports and Recreation

The University boast, a football pitch, basketball court and lawn tennis court for sporting activities.

The University has hostel blocks which can accommodate up to 816 students. Besides, a number of hostels have been constructed around the campus by landlords other than the University. Currently, there are high standard accommodation facilities for over 1000 students within and around Montfort Campus.

Security

The University has access to security services from a near by police unit, two hundred metres away from the campus. The university also outsources security services from a private company whose personnel are on and around the campus 24/7.

Catering

Catering services are outsourced from professional and vetted catering companies.



FACULTIES

The University has seven faculties.

FACULTY OF COMMERCE

The Faculty of Commerce has five programmes: Accountancy, Banking and Finance, Business Administration, Human Resource Management, and Marketing.

Professional Recognition:

Consideration for mature entry (upgrading) is based on Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent with credits in English and Mathematics. ACCA or PAEC advanced diploma are mandatory for those applying for Bachelor of Commerce (Accountancy). Advanced Diploma in Business Management (ABE level 6) is mandatory for those applying for Bachelor of Commerce (Business Administration). Advanced Diploma in Human Resource Management or in Management is mandatory for those applying for Bachelor of Commerce (Human Resource Management). All qualified candidates for Bachelor of Commerce will start from 3rd year 1st semester except for Bachelor of Commerce Banking and Finance who start from 2nd year 2nd semester.

Degree Requirements:

Students are required to submit a dissertation as partial fulfillment for the degree programme.

PROGRAMMES AND ROAD MAPS

All students under the Faculty of Commerce do have general courses for the first two years and they are required to take a minimum of 7 courses each semester.



CUNIMA ROTARACT CLUB
